Kym Scott - The Power of Play

In her speech Kym will explore the thorny issue of ensuring children are challenged in their play. She will highlight the myths that exist in this area and share her views around the conditions that enable truly challenging play to take place.

Kym is an established conference speaker, trainer and consultant in the field of early years education. She has spent the last 20 years working in partnership with schools and settings in a variety of circumstances, both in the UK and overseas and has a proven track record of helping leaders to raise the quality of their early years provision and improve outcomes for children.

As well as supporting at leadership level, she spends a significant proportion of her time working directly in classrooms and nurseries. This is key to ensuring that she retains a deep understanding of the reality and challenges of working with young children, and this work also provides her with numerous real examples to draw upon in her training.

In response to COVID-19 and the lack of opportunity to deliver training in person, Kym created her own subscription-based online early years professional development site, 'The Place to Learn', consisting of pre-recorded, on-demand training videos covering a wide range of aspects of early years pedagogy and practice.

Helen believes in an holistic approach to education. Additionally she is knowledgeable about health education, managing behaviour and the role of the adult in schools. She is the Lead Educator on several, successful courses on FutureLearn.understanding and helping families in need of additional services.

Solving the mystery of mastery in the early years foundation stage (EYFS) reforms: The EYFS educational programme for maths uses the word "mastery". Many primary schools have taken on the mastery approach, but what does this look like in a

nursery or reception classroom? What about if you are a toddler or baby with a childminder or in a day nursery? What does mathematical mastery mean (and look like) when you have been in existence for less than 60 months?


