Introduction

We continue with our focus on safeguarding to ensure you and your team are as informed as possible enabling you to work with other professionals in a joint and focused way, keeping the children and their families safe. In this document you will find current information as well as reminders of information sent to you over the past couple of months.

Please share this information with all your team members.

Staff to child ratios

The Chancellor recently announced an optional change to childcare ratios from 1:4 to 1:5 for twoyear-old children. This change will apply from September 2023.

All other staff-to-child ratios remain the same.

Attendance

We hope that all your early years children have returned as expected this term. Whilst we appreciate that acceptance of early education for children under five years is not compulsory, this is a reminder to providers to ask questions when children do not return to settings, particularly those children who are considered vulnerable. Use your discretion to decide who your vulnerable children are and include those with:

- A child in need plan, a child protection plan or who are a looked-after child
- An education, health, and care (EHC) plan
- Family circumstance presenting challenges for them, such as drug and alcohol misuse, parental offending, adult mental health issues and domestic abuse

If a child does not return to your setting, contact the parent/carer to establish why and if any support can be provided in order to resume attendance.

Consider what other professionals are working with the child for e.g., health visitor, social worker, family worker, portage and notify them that the child is no longer accessing EY provision. Can they support the parent to resume the child's attendance at your setting or another?

Signpost families to <u>FIS</u> when their circumstances change and highlight the wide range of childcare options available in Reading. If you need to report concerns about the child contact <u>Children's Single</u> <u>Point of Access</u>.

Food safety

Changes to the EYFS

3.29: Staffing arrangements must meet the needs of all children and ensure their safety. Providers must ensure that children are adequately supervised, including whilst eating, and decide how to deploy staff to ensure children's needs are met. Providers must inform parents and/or carers about staff deployment, and, when relevant and practical, aim to involve them in these decisions. Children must usually be within sight and hearing of staff and always within sight or hearing. Whilst eating, children must be within sight and hearing of a member of staff.

Childcare and the early years

The House of Commons Education Committee has published a report on support for childcare and the early years in England. Findings include:

- safeguarding issues could be less likely to be identified when a child does not attend an early years setting;
- childcare providers report that a number of children have much higher needs or developmental delays as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic;
- early childhood care and education should be child-focused, safe, and supportive.
