Cranbury College is an Alternative Provision and Pupil Referral Unit for young people in the Reading area. We support children from 5-18 years old in a variety of ways. We support:

- learners recovering from the trauma of permanent exclusion;
- tuition for children and young people in Reading's hospitals;
- children with an EHCP who have been permanently excluded and those who require short term education until a permanent place can be found, in consultation with the SEND team;
- Children Looked After who return to Reading at short notice requiring education until a school can be found or who have been receiving education in AP.
- Outreach support for both primary and secondary sectors
- Re-engagement work supporting students in mainstreams school preventing possible permanent exclusion.
