#### Level 3 SEND Award

This training programme, developed by School Improvement Liverpool, is for Early Years SENCos, or those due to take over the role, wanting to gain a qualification and recognition for their role as an Early Years SENCo. The course is accredited by NCFE CACHE, who are the leading Awarding Organisation for the care sector. Training days comprise of 12 guided learning sessions with time allowed for own research and writing of assignments.

### **EYFS and Beyond**

#### **Childminder SchemaPlay workshops**

This two part training session is designed to help you develop child centred practice by becoming a curious observer, identifying the roots of learning, spotting scheme and schema and being secure in the knowledge that schematic play underpins quality provision.

#### A holistic approach to the EYFS

This training session is designed to help all practitioners, managers & SENCo's working in Early Years to reflect on:

- What underpins the Early Years Foundation Stage framework and why?
- The connection between mind, body & spirit in each child's experience (including using the Characteristics of Effective Learning & the principles of the EYFS)
- To understand how child development features within the Prime & Specific areas of learning

#### Wraparound & holiday activity learning workshops

This is an outside physical workshop to develop practitioners' confidence and knowledge of outside/inside group games. We aim by the end of the session that practitioners will leave with game instructions to develop a 'library' of group games to share and play with their setting.

#### Sensory processing & hand massage workshop

This is a workshop to explore the different senses we have, how these impact on our day-to-day life and supporting children with sensory processing needs in the Early Years. We will explore how you can adapt your environment and provide different activities including hand massage to support children with sensory processing needs.

#### Attention Autism – 2 day course

This 2-day course introduces to practitioners to the 4 Stage Attention Autism programme which is a recommended evidence-based intervention for children with special educational needs. The training focuses on the practical aspects of intervention, working in a team and offering an irresistible invitation to learn.

#### Inclusive practice in the early years

A day workshop giving practitioners the opportunity to explore what inclusive practice is in the early years. This workshop includes good autism practise, therapeutic approach to SEMH introduction and an introduction to sensory needs. Practitioners will take away a variety of ideas to support children and develop universal provision.

#### Portage workshop "A small steps approach to learning"

This two-day workshop consists of 7 modules focusing on The Portage Model, Supporting the development of play, Helping Children Learn - Using Clear Language, Helping Children Learn – Planning for Success, Helping Children Learn – Planning, Recording and Sharing Children's Goals, Helping Children Learn - Using a Small Steps Approach, Positive Approaches to Children's Behaviour.

For those working with children 0-5 in Early years and Foundation stage who are interested in delivering inclusive learning and play activities. Beneficial for practitioners looking to further develop their SEND practice.

#### Intensive Interaction – 3-day practitioner training

A mentored course over three months, with three in-person facilitated study days to develop good intensive interaction practices, using a combination of learning experiences, including: video evaluation, presentations, facilitated discussions and course reading.

The course is aimed at those providing day-to-day care, support and education for children and young people who require support to develop their social communication skills.

It is essential that participants have attended a one day 'Introduction to Intensive Interaction' session.

#### **DfE Early Years child development training**

Overview of child development and practical advice.

#### Virtual wraparound childcare inclusion training

An interactive online course looking at the meaning of inclusion and how it feels to be excluded. This course is aimed at all those working in the wraparound sector including volunteers, apprentices, play workers, leaders and managers. We strongly recommend a whole setting approach to this inclusion course to impact across the whole setting. The course allows you to learn at your own pace once you sign up to the platform, it's been designed so you can literally dip in and out. #### New to childminding

<u>Childminder briefings</u> include Ofsted information on becoming a childminder. They are delivered monthly and are free of charge.

<u>Childminder Introductory Training</u> explores the requirements from the Early Years Statutory Guidance as well as information on running a business.

### **Mental Health and Wellbeing**

#### Therapeutic Thinking (EY and wraparound module)

Philippa from <u>Therapeutic Thinking</u> will deliver virtual training focused on a therapeutic approach to behaviours within both Early Years and Wraparound settings. The sessions will focus on relationships, trauma, planning for and supporting individual children's needs.

#### **PACE training**

PACE stands for Playfulness, Acceptance, Curiosity and Empathy. Being PACEful enables you to have effective, empowering interactions with children who have experienced trauma and who, as a result, do not respond to you in the same way as other children you teach and/or support. It is a useful tool for all children, not just those who have had a difficult start to life. These sessions are designed to help you learn more about this approach, dipping into learning on developmental trauma and attachment theory, and to then practice using it over the course of the second workshop. The sessions will be delivered by Dr Jordan Self, a Specialist Educational Psychologist from the Adopt Thames Valley Anchor Team, a multi-disciplinary therapeutic service serving Berkshire and Swindon.

#### **Trauma Virtual Reality Programme**

The programme is designed to enable users to understand the impact of trauma, abuse and neglect through the eyes of the child from prebirth to adolescence to improve the care, support and guidance that children and young people are provided with. **Please note the films are not designed to be easy viewing & some may find difficult to watch.** 

#### **Virtual Reality Trauma Awareness**

Join Reading Virtual School in the Summer term for an immersive training experience using videos and reflection to understand how adversity and trauma can impact a child's development, presentation and ability to engage in learning. # Early Years - Cancellation Policy

#### Cancellation five working days or MORE before the course date

All cancellations must be made via the SLA or by email to the <u>early.years@brighterfuturesforchildren.org</u> inbox by the delegate or their manager. No telephone cancellations will be accepted.

#### Cancellation LESS than five working days before the course date

Notification must be made via the SLA or by email to the <u>early.years@brighterfuturesforchildren.org</u> inbox. A charge of 50% of the training course per person per training day will be incurred unless there are exceptional circumstances.

#### **Cancellation LESS than 24 hours and non-attendance**

Non-attendance and cancellations that are made with less than 24 hours notice will be charged the **full cost** of the training.

#### Non-attendance of free training

There will be a £20 non-attendance fee for any free training that is not attended and no prior notice is given. A session that is free and has been subsidised by the Early Years team will incur a charge of the full cost of the session for non-attendance.

If you are unable to attend the course due to unforeseen circumstances, email notification from the delegate or manager must be sent to <u>early.years@brighterfuturesforchildren.org</u> and consideration will be given to a waiver of the charge. This is at the discretion of the Early Years team.

# It is the responsibility of the delegate or their line manager to report the absence to: early.years@brighterfuturesforchildren.org

#### Transferring to a later course

Any delegate who wishes to transfer to a later course date and sends written notification to <u>early.years@brighterfuturesforchildren.org</u> less than 5 working days before the course will be charged 50% of the fee per person for the cancelled date.

#### **Substitutions**

Substitutions are welcome, provided the team are notified in advance.

#### **Priority bookings**

If two or more sessions are booked by your setting and not attended/cancelled by you or if there are <u>any</u> outstanding payments for training, you will not be given priority for future sessions until the issues have been resolved.

### **Cancellation by the Early Years Team**

The Early Years team will use their discretion to cancel sessions if the minimum number of participants isn't met. Notification will be given 4 working days prior to the session taking place by email to the email address provided at the time of the booking.
