# **Essential Information**

## BFfC Early Years and SEND Conference: Understanding the Unique Child

We were delighted that so many of you were able to join us on Saturday for our EY and SEND conference, 'Understanding the Unique Child'. Brian Grady, BFfC Director of Education, opened the event by highlighting the importance of children's earliest years and thanked the sector for their commitment to Reading's children.

We welcomed leading experts including:

**Kerry Murphy**, Early Childhood and Neurodiversity Specialist, who focused on a strengths-based approach which both empowers and celebrates children.

Jenna Redmond, BFfC SEND Consultant, introduced us to the work of the RISE (Reading Inclusion in Schools) team and how their work is helping to develop a fully integrated SEND service in Reading. Sharon Priest, BFfC SEND Consultant, encouraged us to think about the provision that is ordinarily available for all children in our settings and the gradated response process.

**Joanna Grace**, an author and trainer, helped us to consider all the ingredients of a super sensory story with an insight into their power to engage learners of all ages and abilities.

**Liz Pemberton,** Early Years Anti-Racist Trainer and Consultant, focused on the impact of structural and systemic racism on children and how we can take practical steps to address this in our work.

There was also an opportunity to enjoy great food and networking together. Thank you to all those who attended and for all your contributions. Also, thank you to Lorna McGifford, EY and Childcare Project Officer, for organising such a special event for the sector.

## DfE press release – EYFS Safeguarding

The Department for Education (DfE) has published its response to the consultation on proposals to strengthen EYFS safeguarding requirements, which ran from 22 April to 17 June 2024.

Based on consultation responses DfE will proceed with implementing all the proposals consulted on, including:

- safer recruitment
- child absences
- safer eating
- safeguarding training
- paediatric first aid training

Additionally, there are two new proposals on providing employment references and to support whistleblowing. The DfE intends to implement the EYFS safeguarding reforms from 1 September 2025.

# A Small Steps Approach to Learning for Children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

Do you want to improve your everyday practice to the benefit of all children, not just those with additional needs? Do you want to develop and achieve real, meaningful inclusion in settings?
