The deadline for returning your Annual Safeguarding Audit is tomorrow, **Friday 31 January 2025**. Remember, safeguarding is everyone's responsibility, and this is your chance to check you have robust policies and procedures in place. So far, we have received 67/81 returns from childminders, 42/56 from settings and 21/23 from schools with nurseries.

New: DfE qualifications

The DfE has announced a package of early years qualification initiatives to support entry and progression within the workforce and to ensure that the staff working with young children have the right skills and knowledge to deliver high-quality provision.

To support early years settings to recruit and retain staff and meet this increased demand, from 3 March 2025 eligible educators will be able to access an <u>experience-based route</u> to working in the Staff:Child ratios at level 3. This new route recognises the significant contribution that skilled and experienced staff can make to the education and care of young children. This is an opportunity for educators without currently approved qualifications, to develop their careers, and for providers to maximise the potential of their talented staff in a way that works best for the children in their care. Alongside the DfE has announced the publication of the <u>Early Years Teacher Degree Apprenticeship</u> <u>standard.</u> This new, graduate-level qualification will give everyone from school leavers and junior staff to senior leaders the opportunity to move into a specialist career in the early years sector.

Children's services to move back into Reading Borough Council

Following on from our message to you in December, we can now confirm that, on 28 January, Reading Borough Council made the decision at Full Council to bring the operation of children's services in Reading back in-house, effectively transferring the good work Brighter Futures for Children has undertaken on its behalf back into the Council. The recommendation and final decision was fully supported by the BFfC Board.

This means that work will now start to transfer Brighter Futures for Children's services and staff back into the Council. It is expected the transition will take around six months, with completion in the autumn. A target transition date will be agreed in the coming weeks.

For now, it continues to be business as usual and the focus, as ever, is to ensure that Reading's children and families continue to be supported throughout this process with minimal disruption to them while the transition takes place.

We also want to reassure you that nothing will change in the immediate future and Brighter Future for Children's relationship with you will continue as is. We will, of course, notify you if anything is likely to affect you and will keep you updated as the transition progresses.

New customer entrance at the Civic from Monday 13 January

From Monday 13 January, the new temporary entrance for customers and guests visiting the Civic will open. The main entrance is being relocated to Simmonds Street for all Council visitors, Brighter Futures for Children services, and attendance to council meetings and training.
