Safeguarding

Safer Sleep Week 2025

A campaign from The Lullaby Trust, takes place 10 to 16 March. See the <u>website</u> for more details and resources to share with families.

Food allergy

Resources are available to aid the fulfilling of statutory duties around managing allergy risks in early years settings. The Natasha Allergy Research Foundation has launched <u>Allergy School</u>, offering free resources to support staff in creating inclusive and safe environments for children with food allergies.

Oral Health

The EYFS framework states that early years providers must promote good oral health of children who attend their setting. A <u>study</u> conducted in 2022 identified that 32% of 5-year-olds in Reading have one or more untreated dentally decayed teeth (higher than the national average of 29%), and 2.5% of 5-year-olds in Reading have had one or more teeth extracted due to dental decay. See the DfE <u>guidance</u> for ideas to support the families you work with, and information on the <u>BrightBites Oral Education Program</u>, which is a free of charge, volunteer run service providing insetting sessions for children to promote the importance of looking after teeth.
