Qualification checker

A new early years qualification checking service for nursery managers has been launched by the DfE to replace the existing qualifications spreadsheet. The aim of the <u>service</u> is to make it easier for managers and owners to check whether an employee or prospective employee's UK qualifications are 'full and relevant' and whether they can count in ratios at Level 2, 3 or 6.

In a world where fast food and convenience meals are the norm, how often do young children stop to wonder where their food comes from? Encouraging this curiosity not only fosters a love for learning but also strengthens their relationship with the food they eat. That's exactly what our new child-led, educational storybook aims to do. Adam and The Potato Adventure, sparks children's natural curiosity and takes them on an adventure to discover how food grows.

Designed with early years development in mind, Adam and The Potato Adventure aligns with the **Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)** framework, covering all key areas of learning, from language development to understanding the world. By placing the child's curiosity at the heart of the story, it encourages questions, exploration, and deeper engagement.
