Safeguarding

EYFS safeguarding reforms – Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

On 17 October 2024, the Department for Education published its <u>official response to the</u> <u>consultation</u> on proposals to strengthen safeguarding requirements in the statutory EYFS framework. These reforms are set to be implemented from September 2025 subject to parliamentary procedure. FAQs in regard to the new safeguarding reforms are attached for your reference.

Protective Preparedness for Education Settings Webinar

The Department for Education (DfE), in partnership with the National Counter Terrorism Security Office (NaCTSO), invites you to the 'Protective Preparedness For Education Settings', a webinar focussed on counter terrorism protective security and preparedness for education settings. The webinar will provide an overview of the Terrorism (Protection of Premises) Act 2025, also known as Martyn's Law, and how education settings can consider counter terrorism protection and preparedness. Domestic Violence

Children of pre-school age tend to be the age group who show most behavioural disturbance such as bed wetting, sleep disturbances and eating difficulties. Children in this age range may feel guilty about the abuse and blame themselves for it. Domestic violence and abuse hurts children's selfesteem. They may have fewer friends than others, and get into trouble more often. - Providing information to parents and prospective parents which is up to date, easily accessible, online and details available childcare, early education and funded spaces in the local area.
- Ensuring the availability of information, advice and training for early years and childcare providers which promotes high-quality provision.

It is essential that we gather information from Reading providers to understand the impact of the advisory offer and what your priorities are for the year ahead.

Scientists say it has to do with how little time they're spending outdoors. Here's why it's so good for your vision. Research shows that spending more time outdoors in daylight can help prevent the development of myopia among children. Being outdoors and focusing on an object at a distance gives your eye muscles a chance to relax. Giving Every Child the best Start in Life

This week the Department for Education (DfE) published the 'Giving Every Child the Best Start in Life' strategy. This aims to bring together early years and family services, putting children's first years at the heart of work to improve life chances.

The publication sets out the first steps in a decade of renewal, with government spending close to ± 1.5 bn over the next three years to begin the work needed. It builds on existing commitments and lays the foundations for further reform.

This includes expanding and strengthening family services, making early education and childcare more accessible and affordable, and improving the quality of early education and childcare to deliver stronger outcomes for children, families and society.

The DfE will work in partnership with the sector, listening to the voices of children and their families, and co-designing solutions with those who work most closely with our youngest babies and children. Read the publication in full here <u>Giving every child the best start in life</u>

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) space requirements consultation open

On 12 May, the Government launched a new space requirements consultation, which runs until 11 July. The consultation is seeking views on whether to introduce flexibility into the EYFS that will allow free-flow outdoor space to be included in the indoor space requirements, with a possible cap
